At KES 2 per Article or Video: 1,000 readers = KES 2,000 per day. 10,000 readers = KES 20,000 per day.

The rest would be about Quality and Creativity; Demand and Supply.

So instead of students agitating for lowering of college tuition, etc, they can forward practical progressive actionable solutions to their college administrations.

One place to start would be an Intra-African Universities Online Collaboration Program.

Student leaders can request their administrations to send formal invitations to other universities and colleges in Africa for online collaborations and partnerships on various online media and platforms (starting with 1AMov.com).
